M.I. Church (India), was started on Dec. 20th 2007 by Rev. Dr. Paulah Kapfo (Nam- Sun Park) Dimapur, Nagaland, India.

1) Nagamese Community Worship

Normally, we hold Nagamese and English worship separately but because of the 3rd floor conference hall construction, we are currently holding combined worship service in Nagamese, the local language, since March this year, at 10:00 a.m. every Sunday.

The students' English worship service is held separately at 8:30 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Sundays. We join the community worship with other church members at 10:00 a.m. so that everyone has the opportunity to enjoy community worship with one heart and mind.

**2) Healing Service**

We hold healing services twice a month. On March 10th, Pastor Meyiete Nuh, came and gave us a testimony about healing and delivered a challenging message on God's grace. On March the 31st, "Love Your Enemies" an evangelistic and prayer team from Kohima, led by Mr. Kusazo Nyekha along with 18 people, led us into praise, prayer, message and healing service.

On Palm Sunday, April 2nd, Rev. Chung Eun Cho from the International Global Partnership Theological Accreditation & Mission (GPTAM), South Korea preached on the topic, *Why did Jesus come?* (Luke 7:11-17) He gave an inspiring message and shared his testimony of church planting, and everyone was divinely blessed.

The *Easter Sunrise Service* was held on the first floor of the Mission Home, and the *Easter Sunday Worship Service* was held in the Conference Hall on the third floor of the main M.I. Building. Missionary Nam Sun Park (Rev. Dr. Paulah) testified about *"The Resurrection of Jesus,"* centering on John 20:19-23.



4) M.I. Revival & Bible Camp

A three-day M.I. Revival and Bible Camp was held from April 7th- 9th during the Passion Week at the M.I. Prayer Centre. About 40 members, mostly new students, volunteers and staff, attended the camp. Through different speakers, the campers learned many things about the death and the resurrection of Jesus.

The last words of Jesus on the cross were looked upon through Bible studies and the meaning of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus, explained through Good Friday Worship, Holy Communion and Easter Sunday Service. The Camp ended with Easter Feast.

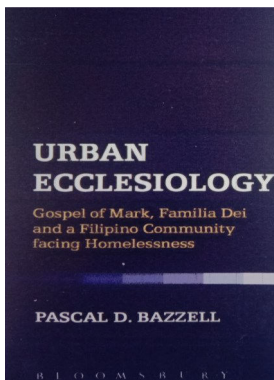
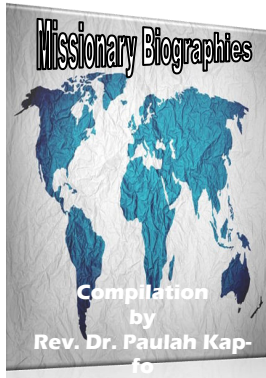
3) Music Class

4) M.I. Press



As a part of Christian literature Mission, M.I. India operates its own Press. Sister Kathy and Brothers James & Chris work in the computer lab to print and copy seminary students' assignments, book binding, and editing photographs. They help students and the ministry a lot. (Especially in situations where seminary text and reference books are difficult to obtain Students benefit much from their assistance).



4. M.I. Prayer House

We give thanks to God for the construction of the stairs to the bathroom at the M.I. prayer house. We can get around without difficulty during the rainy season.

By holding camps such as Good Friday and Easter Sunday, our M.I. Prayer caters to train lives of participants and fill the attendees with the anointing of the Holy Spirit.

Every Sunday at 10 a.m. people from the surrounding areas come to worship. Brothers Khropeto and Sanjay take turns giving the message, sometimes pastors from M.I. church often go to deliver the messages.

On April 19th, Lily Sumi's brother's family went to the prayer house and fasted for three days in the morning, Mr. Neilo Medo, also went there to help them with prayer and counselling.

We pray that through M.I. Prayer House, wonderful healing, spiritual restoration, and salvation of souls will take place. Majority of the neighbours are Muslims, but there also are Hindus and un-churched Christians.



5. Out Reach Mission

1) Helping Fire-Affected Families

On Easter Sunday April 9th, a massive fire broke out in a Burma camp, burning 605 homes to ashes and leaving more than 1,000 people homeless. On Easter afternoon, Rev. Dr. Paulah and the outreach team went to the scene after a street preaching meeting. On observation, it looked very devastated. A Hindu, grandmother who could not walk because of a sore leg, was burned to death before she could not escape, and more than 1,000 lost their homes.

They are living on the streets with nothing. By announcing this news to Korea and several places in Nagaland, Daejeon Daeheung Baptist Church in Korea and Chakhesang Kuzhami Baptist Church in Kohima and M.I. Church actively participated in the relief ministry.



On April 16th, 605 food packages were made with dal and Atta (flour) that the locals eat as staple foods, and other immediate essentials such as salt, soap, etc. were distributed. Candy, bread and water were also provided to the evangelistic area. Most of the people are from Muslim and Hindu backgrounds.

On April 18th, another fire broke out in Kuda Village, Dimapur. More than 10 houses were burned down, and M.I. India donated dal, potatoes, cooking oil, rice, eggs and onions. One family, who had lost everything in the flash fire, wept lamenting, "I cried so much that I don't even have the strength to cry anymore."

It is our hope that the governments, charities, churches and volunteers will practice love of neighbours and show the love of the Lord by actively helping strangers in crisis as much as possible.



2) Hindi Bethel Baptist Church Worship



On March 26th, at 10 a.m., Missionary Rev. Dr. Paulah went to Hindi Bethel Baptist Church (Pastor Anoop's Church) to preach the word of God during the Sunday service.

She preached on Ephesians 3:6-9 and testified "*The abundant grace of Christ is beyond measure.*" As she prayed for the saints after the service, an amazing work of the Holy Spirit took place.



3) Saturday & Sunday Evangelism

Every Saturday at 8 a.m., MIGSM & MIDS Students and staff are divided into seven teams to preach the Gospel to Muslim and Hindu villages. At 2 p.m. on Sundays, the outreach team goes to Burma camp (name of a locality) to hold evangelistic meetings in the streets. Many children, mothers, and young adults attend. Everyone is actively involved in singing, Bible stories, Bible recitations and quizzes.



This year, Brother Paul and Sister Lemnya are working hard in many ways for the outreach team in Dimapur, Nagaland. It is said to be "*the golden fishery of the Gospel*", so even Muslims and Hindus accept the Gospel without hostility.

4) Making Toilets in Sundarban, Kolkata

"Open Door Mission" of Myeongseong Full Gospel Church, Korea, made the toilet at Sundarban District, Kolkata, in the Nazir Missionary's Mission field, where Mr. Neurosu is the Pastor. It may not seem much but by building two toilets, the congregation who come to church have been helped greatly. Rev. Ron Smith, President of the "Global Sharing Mission Organization" in the United States, visited the area and stayed there for three weeks to share the vision of missions and support a little bit every month from now on.



The missionary's wife gave birth prematurely (7 months) and was rushed to the hospital, but with God's help, she gave birth to a baby after surgery, and fortunately, both mother and son are healthy. Please pray that son Adam will continue to grow up well and that his wife will be able to take good care of the baby and help in the ministry.



5) Mengkeng Baptist Church, Arunachal



The construction of Mengkeng Baptist Church, located at Mengkeng Village under Namsai District, Arunachal Pradesh, is served by Pastor Tarun Chungkrang. It was temporarily suspended due to financial difficulties, but with the help of Rev. Kim in Korea, it has been resumed and the Roofing construction is being carried out. Construction of the church has begun with the cooperation of the "Open Door Mission." Pray that it will be completed before the anniversary of the church in September this year.

6) Mission Conference and AATA Meeting at Chiang Mai, Thailand.

Rev. Dr. Kenny and Rev. Chang Kuk Han attended the 29th World Mission Conference at Hotel Furamaand at Chiang Mai, Thailand and also for the installation of Harvest University President of Dr. Chung Hung Hoin Chiangmai, Thailand, 22nd -27th April 2023 this also coincided with the Asia-Africa-Theological Association (AATA) Meeting. We are grateful for the meaningful meetings and good fellowship with the Seminary professors.




6. M.I. India 4th Floor Construction (Hostel & Seminar Room)

With the grace of God and the help of South Korea mission minded individuals and churches, the construction of the 3rd floor was completed except floor tiles, Electric lights were fixed and we are grateful to have worship and meetings in the brightness at night. Due to the increasing number of Bible College students and discipleship students, there was a shortage of dormitories, so the construction of the fourth floor was hastened. Including staff, about 70 people live in the community, but there is a lack of accommodation when new students arrive. The architectural structure is the hostel on the left, the seminar hall on the right and the broadcasting room in the middle. Two toilets and shower rooms are also under construction.

During Friday morning social work, students carry cement, sand and bricks, they help a lot in the construction. When the 4th floor construction is completed, the plan is to put tiles on the floor of M.I. Conference Hall on the 3rd floor and to expand the library during the summer vacation. God has been faithful throughout the years and through the sacrifice of many people. The construction of the M.I. India Centre and Seminary will hopefully be completed before the Mission Conference this year on 4th Oct. where M.I. Seoul 31st & M.I. India 17th Anniversary Celebration will be held. Please continue to pray for God's constant provision.
