What a joy to see our lovely students adorned in coloured graduation attires and names being called out to receive their certificates! The mark of our credibility; having stood the test of time in training and producing quality students; the assets of the community.



Bridgeworld College's Uniqueness

Higher education landscape is undergoing significant change as a result of technological innovations. We are witnessing changes in the way higher education is taught and learnt. While the conventional setting of the lecture hall will continue to form the bedrock of higher education systems, it will be enhanced by the integration of new tools and pedagogies, and it will be complemented by many more online learning opportunities.

Methods of teaching can be better tailored to individual student's needs and there is enormous potential for widening access to higher education and increasing the

diversity of the student population. In response to such needs as of availability of students for class in today's busy era, Bridgeworld College has adopted a new mode of teaching. Over the past 14 years we have had regular classes running on weekly basis. However with the new changes we have adopted a more flexible mode of study.

This model will require that students take up a unit of study for one whole week at the beginning of every month, and there after write their assignments and projects from home. This flexibility is essential for non-traditional learners and will enable a shift change in the engagement of students in lifelong learning and continuing professional development.

Extensions

Besides the classes conducted from the main campus in Karen, Bridgeworld College has extended its roots to other areas offering certificate and diploma classes to students who are not able to attend classes at the main campus due to various reason like distance and availability among others. The first extension center was the Meru extension campus (Mitunguu Market, Kaare Mwimbi, Nkubu, Kanyakine, Karaa and Chogoria) which has been in existence since 1st of August, 2011. Last year, another one was started at Sanctuary of Love in Dandora Phase 4 opposite Kinyago Primary School, training and graduated 21 students in Theology at certificate level. Early this year another one in Ukambani area (Kangundo, Kikambuani, Kinyui and Tala) began.

These extension are facilitated and coordinated by our alumni and lecturers who are in liaison with the main campus. These classes are conducted uniquely from one extension campus to another; Meru classes are done during school breaks (school based), Dandora has classes on three days (randomly) of each month and Ukambani

run on the 2nd and 3rd Saturdays of the month.

Students get the same quality of knowledge as the ones in the main campus and at the end of their

programs graduate and receive the same certificates for their various programs.

Bridgeworld is not only working and focusing on building national/international bridges but has gone down to the grassroots to make sure that education and transformation for this matter is channeled properly from bottom going upwards.
