



## M.I. INDIA Nagaland Mission News (June 2022)

### **1. M.I. Graduate School of Missions (MIGSM)**

#### **1) M.I. Spiritual Restoration Camp (M.I. Restoration & Recovery Camp)**

From June 1 to 8, we conducted the final exam, and on June 8, at 2:30 pm, we had the closing worship service for the First Semester. Rev. Dr. Kenny delivered the message.

M.I. Spiritual Recovery Camp was held from June 9-12, with few brothers who needed prayer, spiritual recovery and who could not attend early morning prayer meetings along with some volunteer brothers.

The theme of the camp was focused on Repentance and Restoration with the slogan “Acknowledge your sins, confess and forsake them” based on Proverbs 28:13.

3 days morning fasting until 12 noon was observed, along with worship services, seminars (various addictions, emotional difficulties, freedom, self-control, discipline, repentance and devotion, etc.), testimonies, Bible writing and recitation, prayer meetings, praise practice, and social work for dignity of labor.



We had a precious time intensively training 12 disciples. In the midst of the heat and difficult environment, the instructors and other personnel worked together to make *"The Best Camp in My Life"*

Seeing the transformation of many brothers who attended the camp while spending time with the Word, in prayer, and counseling, it appeared that the sweat was worthwhile.

Brother Meyie received the Best Camper Award, and the 2nd and 3rd place went to Brother Rece, and Brother David respectively.

After the camp, some of them went to Arunachal for short-term ministry, while others lead the summer Vacation Bible school. I give glory and thanks to God who made my joy double as much as it was difficult.



## 2) Summer Vacation Intensive Course

Now that the summer vacation is here, seminarians have returned to their hometowns, except for few students from distant provinces who remain at the school, and the bustling school campus has quieted down.

After few days of rest, the Summer Vacation Intensive Course started on Monday, June 13th, and we began studying the English Bible and English language.

Along with those who are writing thesis, some staff and 20 seminary students are taking credited courses such as The Life of Jesus Christ and English Conversation, Composition, Grammar, etc.

As a special lecture for about two weeks, Miss. Beteü Losou, who studied in Korea, taught beginner and advanced English classes. Mhechieu, Aghakali, John, and Rev. Dr. Paulah are teaching English Bible.

In the beginners class, Miss. Weneu, Viletuonuo, Beteü Losou, and Aneile are working as instructors, and Professor Inato is intensively teaching advanced English for the remainder of the period.

In particular, during this summer vacation, students and staff are all working hard to write the Gospel according to Matthew to have better understanding of Jesus' life and ministry.



## 2. M.I. Church

### 1) Father's Day Worship

Although it is a vacation, the church ministry continues.

On June 17 (Fri), at 4 pm, Rev. Dr. Nam-Sun Park led the Spiritual Restoration and Healing Service Meeting, and on Father's Day, June 19, Rev. Dr. Kenny delivered a message. M.I. Church Mothers, Sunday School Students, and Rev. Dr. Nam-Sun Park prepared special gifts for the fathers and presented them with united prayers.



### 2) Nagamese Morning Prayer and Afternoon Prayer

Men's and women's fellowship members and pastors continue to attend the morning prayer meetings (5 am), individual prayer meeting (4-5 pm) , and intercession prayer meeting (5 pm), which are of great help.

Most of the students have returned home, but about 20 students and staff remain, so the morning devotion continues at 6 am.

Women's fellowship service at 10 A.M. on Wednesdays, small group fasting prayer meetings, and Sunday afternoon men's fellowship services are also growing with grace.

During the summer vacation, Saturday evangelism, Jesus loves ministry and Burma Camp Outreach missions have been given a break. But Children Sunday School, Teens and youth fellowships are going on. Children Sunday Teachers are preparing for Summer Vacation Bible School (VBS) to be held in July.



### 3) Assam Region Summer Vacation Bible School (VBS)

Six M.I. Sunday School teachers went to Kulajan, Assam, the hometown of Brother David for VBS program. They went to a Kulajan Baptist church and led Summer Vacation Bible School from June 15 -19 and gave a special song during the worship.

The church, local residents and children welcomed them with joy and asked the teachers to come again next year. I hope that God's praise and reward will come to Sister Tshekuteü, leader of Sunday School ministry, and to all other teachers who have worked hard.

Trains were cut off due to floods in Assam with heavy toll on the residents around. However with the help of the Army Personnel they could arrange another train and arrived safely.



### 3. M.I. Vocational Center (MIVC)

#### 1) Vocational Training and Skill Training

Even during the vacation period, Korean language, guitar, piano and vocal classes are taken in the afternoon for the students. Sister Lenam went to learn dressmaking techniques, and there are some staff and students who are attending computer classes.

The school security staff Bhim Bahadur and wife are working hard to grow various vegetables at Mission Home.

Mrs. Lily Sumi, M. I. Church member, produced many crafts and her handiworks were chosen to display at Handicrafts Expo organized by the Government.



## 2) Completion of Staff Houses

Mrs. Shanti, who cleans the M.I. Church's chapel hall every day and attends morning and afternoon prayer meetings every day have moved into a new house to live with the family .

By building two rooms, a kitchen, and a bathroom for each household, we are able to avoid the trouble of water leakage that happens every summer in rainy season.

The construction was completed in two weeks with the help of the brothers engaged in construction works from among the church members along with the dedicated cooperation of other members. Joseph's family moved in on 19th and Shanti's family moved in on 26th June with grateful hearts.



## 4. M.I. Prayer House

During the camp, our brothers helped to carry heavy Ring materials for bathroom construction. Currently, the architecture team, Rev. Dr. Kenny, staff, and some male students have gone to help and oversee the work. They are working hard to make the toilets and shower rooms on time.

So far, M.I. Prayer House has availed only a temporary toilets which made it hard to use by the members and guests during special programs. This is why we started the construction by faith.

We pray that the toilets and shower rooms will be well completed under God's continuous provision to cater to the needs during gatherings and for visitors in the future.



Brother Paul finished 7-days fasting from June 17th to 23rd at the M.I. Prayer House with grace.

His studies were suspended for various reasons, but after fasting, he took the remaining courses for the master's program resuming on the 27th.

Brother Sanjay, who has been helping the ministry of the Prayer House, has gone to his hometown due to knee surgery, he had hard time but now got healed and returned to M.I. Prayer House. He shared the word of God at Phek in his hometown.

Currently, Brother Awang is alone at the Prayer House but the members used to go there from time to time to preach the word and lead special songs.



## 5. Outreach Missions

With the help of Korea's Open Door Mission (Representative Rev. Dr. Shin Kyoung-Soo),

We are grateful that churches are being built.

Recently, following the dedication ceremony of Anugra Baptist Church in Siliguri where Pastor Timothy works. We have started again to build three more churches at Kathalbari in Tripura where Pastor Lalchoisang works, Mengkeng Baptist Church in Arunachal where Pastor Torun works and in Sundarban Area, Kolkota where Missionary Nasir works.

Please pray that the foundation work, necessary materials, and construction will proceed smoothly after the summer rainy season is over.

In the area where Pastor Melvin Singson in Tripura works, members donated to buy used car, and donations were also sent from the sponsoring church in Korea, but the price of the car is high, so they still need about 2.5 million won.



M.I. Missionary Daniel is working at Light of Life Church in Menkeng Area of Namsai in Arunachal and 7 other boys are staying together with him. Recently, about 70 students have joined the after-school class taken in the afternoon to learn English lessons. We found a chef among the locals, and Brother Wedekhro, who completed his MIGSM bachelor's degree, went to help the ministry on June 23rd.
